- Behavioral diagnosis, design, and quasi-experimental evaluation conducted in Eastern Province, Zambia
- Adaptation process and feasibility testing conducted in Bong County, Liberia

Harsh treatment is normalized and has no consequences



Providers focus on death avoidance over everything else




The pain of labor, and the implications of being in pain, is part of the challenge

A range of cues and tools placed throughout the ward to continuously prompt supportive care.




#### A box in the ward where women drop tokens into the slot which captures her birth experience.





# Results of Quasi-Experimental Evaluation (Zambia)

Pain management support increased

Clients experienced less disrespect and abuse (15%)

Providers' level of empathy towards clients improved

No change in client expectations or satisfaction

- Exploring funding opportunities to support research and implementation at larger-scale

#### Liberia

- Supported Ministry of Health to develop a 5-year strategy for Respectful Maternity Care

- Opportunities to advise MOH and implementing partners in how to deploy solutions
